Equine Welfare Policy

At Pathway Ponies, the welfare of our ponies is at the heart of everything we do. We understand that in order for our ponies to live full, happy and healthy lives they must be physical and mental healthy. We are fully committed to ensuring their physical, emotional, and mental wellbeing is prioritised at all times, and we take every step to create an environment that supports the ponies natural behaviours, health, and happiness.

1. Pony Care and Management

Our ponies' physical health is paramount. They are provided with the best possible care, including regular veterinary check-ups, vaccinations, farrier care, dental care, and parasite control. Their diet is carefully managed to meet their individual nutritional needs, and they are provided with fresh water, clean bedding, suitable grazing, turn out and ample space to move freely. We ensure that their living environment is safe, secure, and comfortable, allowing them to fully engage in natural behaviours such as grazing, resting, and socialising.

2. Mental Health and Emotional Well-being

We recognise that the mental health and emotional wellbeing of our ponies are just as important as their physical care. We are committed to providing an environment where they feel safe, relaxed, and free from stress. Our ponies are regularly monitored for signs of anxiety, fear, or distress, and we take immediate action to address any concerns. We understand the impact of the work they do and ensure that their interactions are always positive, supportive, and respectful of their individual personalities and needs.

3. Workload, Location, and Type of Work
